Mayor Martin was asked about the funding for the police cruisers. The funds are coming out of several funds; Public Service, Mayor's Budget, and Police Budget.

Ms. Cahill summarized Chief Floyd was authorized to order one (1) new police cruiser and the dealership ordered two (2) police cruisers. Now the Police Department has need of two (2) police cruisers to be replaced. Council already approved one (1) new cruiser, the second is available and so is the funding.

Mayor Martin added in the next budget, we will not be asking for a cruiser if we get these two (2). If we do not, then we will be asking in the 2024 Budget.

Ms. Warner asked if there will be a need to purchase a vehicle in the 2024 Budget? Also, what is the total cost, including outfitting?

Mayor Martin responded there will not be a need. The goal is to get all police cruiser under 100,000 miles and replace them at 120,000 miles.

Acting Chief of Police Smith responded to the total cost. The total cost for two (2) cruisers is \$120,000 and we will have a trade in. Currently, there is a verbal agreement over the phone for the trade in.

President Hall asked who does the outfitting?

Acting Chief of Police Smith responded "PARS" does the fitting for the cruisers. One (1) cruiser is being worked on right now.

Ms. Warner asked how many total vehicles will the police have?

Mayor Martin responded we are replacing two (2) and one (1) is leaving. One (1) car is for back up and another for training. So, the total is seven cars and the K-9 car. Lastly, to answer some of your questions, the Acting Chief of Police is working on getting a K-9 officer by the end of the year.

Ms. Cahill explained the Police Committee had a meeting recently to go over Resolution 23-037.

Department Reports:

Report for Mayor — <u>Mayor Martin</u> reported the Girl Scouts of America planted over 1,000 trees in the Village. Governor DeWine, Senator Hacket and the Madison County Sherriff were also with them. Second, the Chamber of Commerce gave another tour of Medline ahead of their grand opening in June. Medline also offered a tour to any member of Council. Third, we are still in communications with Norfolk Southern Railroad, PUCO, Senator JD Vance, Senator Brown, and Representative Carey. Representatives from PUCO asked the Village to remove the word 'critical' from the vocabulary about the viaduct. The reason was Norfolk Southern Railroad has a good record of inspections. The Mayor asked if that good record of inspects includes East Palestine OH, Queensland OH, and Springfield Oh tracks? Fourth, we all need to remember that the corner of Kirkwood and Park Dale is a school zone and our concern is for the children. We will have background checks to try to get crossing guards. Lastly, the Police Department's simulator has a new screen.

Report for Director of Public Service — <u>Mr. Mitchell</u> reported Westwood Park rubber installation starts 3 May 2023. Second, the Westchester subdivision reconstruction projects remains on schedule. However, inclement weather could slow progress. Third, the paving program sidewalks are about 85% complete, the storm sewers should be finished this week, and the fire hydrants are relocated and valves replaced. Fourth, the Walker Way extension work will start later this week. Fifth, there was a large water main break on Saturday, 29 April 2023. This caused RT 29 closure and lower pressure in the Industrial Park area. Lastly, work has started on the clarifier replacement at the Waste Water Treatment Plant.

Report for Recreation and Special Events Manager – <u>Mr. Stanley reported on the Summer Pool Season</u> pool passes and reference a flyer sent out with upcoming activities.

Report for Director of Finance — <u>Ms. Jackie Tinberio</u> reported for the Director of Finance and explained the auditors have begun. We are busy with them. The tax season is done but we are still processing. We had one (1) revenue item over \$10,000.00; the City of London for \$33,750.00 and the total receipts were 86 for \$387,519.65. We had several payment items over \$10,000.00; Duke Reality for the 1st half TIF distribution for \$53,040.42 and MNJ Technologies Direct for a software platform for \$12,250.00. The total payment receipts were 93 for \$210,339.55.

Report for Chief of Police — <u>Acting Chief Smith</u> reported over the last two (2) weeks we had more patrols and focuses on the safety of children. The second week there were 12 citations given out. The total stops made during that period was 19. The officers are still very present at the school in various locations, physically at the crosswalks and the cruiser is nearby. The overall traffic stops over the last two (2) weeks is 125 and 74 resulted in citations. Lastly, our training has resulted in have a fully functioning department.

Report for Director of Development – $\underline{Mr.\ Hale}$ reported inspection are on pace to exceed the first quarter by 30% to 35%. We started s subdivision in Mt. Sterling and Plain City. In about two (2) weeks our software will allow all our business to be online. We are in the training process right now.

Report for Director of Information Technology - nothing to report.
