Leaf Collection Continues

Leaf collection continues in the Village until Wednesday, November 26, 2025.

We ask that leaves be ready for collection as soon as possible, realizing that some leaves drop much sooner or later than others.

Hate raking leaves? You may prefer mulching the leaves on your lawn rather than raking them up to be collected. Leaf mulch returns nutrients to the soil and is a great option, if your leaf drop isn't too deep.

Please remember to rake leaves to be collected to the curb or street edge, not into the street or over storm inlets. Piles should be no larger than 5 feet wide, and not near any parked cars. Still have questions? Call Ricco Ratliff at (614) 379-5247.



Leaf Collection will be from October 13 – November 26, 2025

Leaf collection crews will have a truck working on a daily basis. The speed of the collection program depends greatly on the weather. Rain and snow will slow down the collection.

Please try to get your leaves ready for collection as soon as possible.

The Village will try to update collection areas on the Village Facebook page, Village of West Jefferson Ohio on a daily basis, but weather, amount of leaves to be collected, and manpower may cause changes to the schedule.

Remember, mulching your leaves with a lawnmower returns nutrients to the soil, and is another option.

- Rake leaves to the curb or street edge, not into the street or over storm water inlets
- Piles should be no larger than 5 feet wide
- Parked cars must be at least 20 feet away from the pile, or the leaves will not be removed. If on street parking is hindering your leaf collection, call Ricco Rattliff at (614) 379-5247 for assistance.
- Please remove sticks, branches and grass clippings from leaf piles.
