MINUTES OF NOVEMBER 15, 2021 COUNCIL MEETING

Meeting Called to Order: 7:00 P.M. by President Warner.

Erica Bogner said, "I would like to talk about the apartments from the perspective of a renter. Before I purchased my house, I lived in an apartment here in town called Chapel Square. During the short stay, it was bad. For example, the carpet was dirty, the landlord would not replace the leaky gas stove, and the water heater only supplied about ten minutes of hot water. All of these issues were refused and not replace or fixed during our entire stay. The reason I am mentioning this is people have asked the question about receiving bad renters but I want to ask the question what if we get a bad landlord? The Village should also consider this. It is for this reason that I am an advocate for single family homes. Owning one's own home will encourage residents to invest in their own community. Where a landlord will not spend money and a renter invest in something not their own, a home owner will. I understand that Coughlin does not want to build single family homes but if they listen to residents, then they would hear the peal for single family homes, change tactics, and, although not as profitable, it is what the majority of residents want."

Ms. Hall asked, "Erica, what year was that?"

Erica Bogner said, "About 2012 to 2014, until I bought my own home. My dad was a resident there for ten years. We had to threaten legal action at one point ... it was dangerous to him."

Mr. Conway asked, "Erica, what infrastructure limitations are you talking about?"

Erica Bogner said, "The viaduct. I feel that the traffic can't support too much more growth without compounding ... I get stuck in traffic. Its stop-and-go. Single family homes are a slower rate."

Resolution 21-082, Amending Resolution 21-079, passed October 18, 2021, setting Employee Cell Phone Reimbursement Allowances, adding IT Manager.

Motion to Adopt Resolution 21-082 moved by Ms. Cahill and seconded by Ms. Hall.

Roll Call: Six (6) yeas, zero (0) nays, and one (1) abstain. Motion Carries 6-0-1.

Resolution 21-083, authorizing the Mayor and Director of Public Service to enter into a Pre-Annexation Agreement with the Raymo Corporation, Romo Investment, and the Landowners.

Motion to Adopt Resolution 21-083 moved by Mr. Conway and seconded by Mr. Wade.

Roll Call: All yeas. Motion Carries 7-0.

Resolution 21-084, setting forth a statement of municipal services the Village of West Jefferson will provide to the 4.390 +/- acres of land, located in Jefferson Township, and proposed to be annexed to the Village of West Jefferson via Expedited Type II Annexation pursuant to R.C. 709,023; and the Buffer Requirements, as provided by R.C. 709.023 (C).

Motion to Adopt Resolution 21-084 moved by Mr. Conway and seconded by Mr. King.

Roll Call: All yeas. Motion Carries 7-0.

Resolution 21-085, authorizing the Chief of Police to purchase for the Police Department DART ST System and related equipment, not to exceed \$14,000.00.

President Warner invited comments.

Chief Floyd said, "DART started out building military flight simulators. They have a projection screen with a projector, with a pre-programed in from Ohio Police Officer Training Academy, and targets. The entire course is set and uses a laser gun. We still have a live ammo training place but this allows the police officer to have a quick training before the shift. It also runs scenarios, a 'bad guy' with a knife, gun, or cell phone. Myself and one of our Detectives went to Cambridge to use their DART ST system. It works very well.

President Warner asked, "Will this print out a report to tell you how they are doing?"

Chief Floyd said, "At the end of the course, it gives a report, takes the officer back to where they shot, and marks how long it took at that particular stage - whether the shot hit or missed. If an officer has a problem aiming, then a simple bull's eye is put up for practice. It can be programed with the 'bad guy' walking across the street in 30 or 15 seconds. The gun is a simulated SIG 320 and an AR-15, with similar weight and size as the real gun.

Ms. Cahill said, "It is great to practice. It feels like the gun, saving on ammo, and something done on sight is a good thing.

Mr. Wade said, "Chief, does this measure their timing as well?"

Chief Floyd said, "Yes. When you plot a course, it is programed for 3 seconds. The target appears for whatever it is programed to appear as. Likewise, the 'bad guys' are programed to walk, run, or lay on the floor. For example, one program is a protest. The protestors are walking around. Then the 'bad guy' comes walking through and shooting through."

Mr. Wade asked, "So, there are scenarios?"

Chief Floyd said, "Yes. It could be a school building, or whatever it is programed to be."

Mr. King asked, "Does the current system put kids in it too?"

Chief Floyd said, "The current system is one person, with a red or blue shirt. Any update DART puts out is free. In the next update, cars will be added."
